FAWCETT COLLECT'S

General Development. The growing realisation of the need for the services of trained workers in housing management is evidenced by the large number of new posts which have arisen in the course of the year. We regret to report the deaths of Miss Florence Hill, youngest sister of Miss Octavia Hill, and of Mr. H. Robinson, who had done valuable work for the Society in Cape Town and who accepted Associate Membership in July 1936.

The Quarterly Bulletin has been considerably enlarged in size and in scope and this change has called forth many expressions of appreciation from members.

In its new form the Bulletin has been available for propaganda purposes to a greater extent than in the past. Demand for information on the Society's activities continues to be keen and has been met both by the revision of the existing material and the production of information in new forms. The pamphlet "Housing Estate Management by Women" has been reprinted and revised during the course of the year. A new and abridged pamphlet entitled "Municipal Housing Management by Women" has been prepared by Miss Thompson and widely used. Miss Thompson's article "Day of a Housing Estate Manager" has been reprinted from "A Day in My Official Life", published by the Institute of Public Administration.

Information on Octavia Hill methods of housing management has been further disseminated in Scotland by the Secretary and by Miss Thompson, who visited Glasgow, Edinburgh and other important centres between November 1935 and February 1936.

Annual Provincial Conference. The Annual Provincial Conference was held at Manchester in the week-end of May 2nd and 3rd. Mr. Leonard Heywood, Housing Director, arranged an interesting visit to Wythenshawe Estate on the morning of May 2nd. A much appreciated feature of the Conference was the lecture given by Mr. E. C. Kaufmann, Dipl. Ing., Late Director of Housing, City of Frankfurt a/M, on the subject of "Low-Income Housing on the Continent". Members' meetings were devoted to the important subjects of Incorporation and Training. The application of the Housing Act 1935 was also discussed. It was decided that the office of President should remain vacant until further notice.

The debt of gratitude already owed by the Society to Mr. Parker Morris for his interest and advice has been increased still further during the current year by the Society's decision to apply to the Board of Trade for a Certificate of Incorporation. This is a most important step, which will provide the Society with a legal basis upon which to develop in the future and we are most fortunate in having Mr. Parker Morris to guide us through the legal questions involved.

An interesting feature of the Society's work during the current year has been in the extension of our contracts with other, countries. Miss Hurst has been steadily consolidating the work in Cape Town and making valuable contacts with officials and persons interested in housing questions in other parts of South Africa. In December 1935 we had the pleasure of welcoming Miss Orlandini, a student from South Africa, who is undertaking a year's practical training with the Society and is at the same time studying for the Sanitary Science Certificate of the Royal Sanitary Institute. Later she will leave for a tour of study on the Continent. She was followed in August 1936 by Miss Sales, also from South Africa, who will undertake a similar course of study and training. Our first student from the U.S.A., Miss Mayer, began a course of training with the Society in August 1936. In the summer of 1936 the Secretary paid a visit to the U.S.A., making contacts with housing officials and lecturing on the Octavia Hill system of housing management in seven large cities. The tour was a valuable continuation of the work accomplished two years ago by Sir Raymond Unwin, Dr. Kahn and Miss Samuel. It was also possible to break entirely fresh ground in San Francisco and Los Angeles.

Housing Act 1935 (Evidence to Central Housing Advisory Committee and Scottish Advisory Housing Committee). The Society was invited to give evidence on Octavia Hill methods Housing Advisory Committees set up under the 1935 Act in England and Scotland and welcomed the opportunity thus afforded of co-operating with these bodies. Miss Jeffery and Miss Thompson prepared Memoranda describing a typical week's work in their offices at the request of Mr. Howes, Secretary of the Sub-Committee on Management of the Central Housing Advisory Committee, and later gave oral evidence before the Sub-Committee, along with Mrs. Barclay and Miss M. R. Baskett. The Scottish Housing Advisory Committee applied direct to the Secretary for information on the Octavia Hill system.

The deficit of $\pounds 123$. 14. 4. on this year's Revenue Account is Finance. due to the Council's decision to reserve in this and all future years one half of each student's training fees for the second year of her training. As the Society's expenses in respect of the student extend over the whole period of the training, it is obviously fair that the training fee should also be spread over the whole period. Now that the initial step has been taken, the Society's annual income should not be materially affected and the administration of the Society's finances will be made easier by having this reserve available in the early months of each financial year.

During the year National Savings Certificates to the value of f 148. 1. 8. have been realised and the money re-invested in $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ War Stock. The sum of f 58. 4. 7. has been spent on improving the office equipment and furniture and it will be necessary to repeat this expenditure annually during the next few years in order to bring the office equipment up to a satisfactory standard.
