The following amendment shall be made in the Regulations for the administration of the Factory Act:—

In section 3, the words "In silk filature by machinery" shall be deleted².

[&]quot;3. In silk filature by machinery, in spinning, and in the manufacture of woven silk goods for export in the factories specified for the purpose by a notification of the prefectural governor, the occupier may extend the daily working hours of persons under sixteen years of age or of women to 12 hours till 31st August, 1931. Nevertheless, this rule shall not apply if he divides the workers into two or more shifts and sets them to work alternately."

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
