because I have no time to write  
to you both on Tuesdays.

I don't think I shall be able to  
get to home on Friday unless  
uncle is out. Poor old Daddy  
However Auntie has always  
done so much for us as I  
must stay here while I can be  
of use. I do hope you will  
get on all right tomorrow.  
I am sure you will if you  
don't get too frightened. Just  
speak as if you were talking  
don't make too many notes.  
As for Olive Chen I am sure she  
will manage the talk on Switzer-  
land quite nicely - that will  
be easy. I am so glad  
you have another garden.  
They know you take an interest

in it. Have you enough plants  
for it? ~~What~~ How jolly to have  
such a nice office. You are  
lucky girls. Helen has gone  
to stay with Dorothy for a  
while as there was no one here  
to look after her. I am so glad  
Helda is in the school house.  
I've the hire. You would have  
seen so little of her if she  
had been in the house.
