Apart from the constant demand for organizers to help form new societies we are greatly in need of further funds if we are to obey the express orders of the Council and take part in all bye--elections. We cannot insist too strongly on the fact that our best opportunity for educational work is during the political activities of a bye-election, and the voters' petitions sent in to the House of Commons bring home our demand to Members as nothing else does. In Edinburgh one out of every four voters signed our petition. We are also faced for the first time with the organized opposition of a dead weight of inherited prejudice and only steady and persistent educational work can deal with this.

Btilliant raids must fail unless the whole army moves steadily forward over the ground thus won.
