REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30th NOVEMBER, 1929.

The Committee of the Union of Jewish Women submit their 26th Annual Report for the year ending 30th November, 1929. The general work of the Union has been well maintained and there have been several new developments. In fact, on the whole, it has been a year of great activity and endeavour for the Union, further particulars of which will be reviewed in the following pages. The Committee record with deep sorrow the loss that the Union has sustained by the death of several valued supporters and active workers. Lady (Isidore) Spielmann passed away in February, and in her the Union has lost a good friend. Mrs. Algernon Lesser had been connected with the Union for many years, and such an active and enthusiastic worker in the Community will be very difficult to replace. Her death in June was a great grief to the many who knew and loved her. During the compilation of the Report we hear, with very great regret, of another serious loss to the Union of our valued and generous friend, Mrs. George Mosenthal, who passed away early in December.

Executive Committee Miss Lucy Cohen, who had been connected with the Union since its inception in 1902, resigned in February from the Executive Committee. The Committee are pleased that they will still have her support as a Vice-President and as a Member of the Housing Sub-Committee. Mrs. C. Q. Henriques, who had worked so ably for the Union for many years, and was the most successful and careful Loan Fund Treasurer and a valued member of the Executive Committee, tendered her resignation during the year. The Committee greatly regret her decision, but rejoice that they will have the benefit of her sound and sympathetic advice as a Vice-President. It is gratifying to know that the Executive Committee maintains its original force, and has co-opted Lady Nathan and Mrs. John Sebag-Montefiore, both of whom will be formally

proposed for election at the Annual General Meeting in February.

The Union of Jewish Women feels that this Report would not be complete without a record of the deep debt of gratitude it owes to Mrs. Model for the wonderful manner in which she served as its President from 1925 to 1929. In addition to all the onerous duties which her self-sacrifice entails on her in her service to the Community, Mrs. Model has been a constant worker at the Office and ready at all times with her knowledge and advice. The Executive Committee are grateful that they retain her interest and her valuable help as Chairman of the Committee.

Correspondents and Branches The Committee take this opportunity of thanking their Correspondents and Secretaries of Branches in the Provinces, in the Colonies, and in Continental towns, for their valuable assistance. Mrs. Stone, who organised a large and successful branch in Sheffield, continues to give active and enthusiastic help. The Union frequently has occasion to call on its supporters to give advice, help, or hospitality to visitors to their town. We are glad to welcome a new Correspondent in Budapest, Mrs. Ethel Baracs, and we trust that we shall benefit by her help and co-operation for many years to come.

Meetings A General Meeting of the Union was held on Monday, 31st December, 1928, by kind permission of Lady (Herbert) Samuel, at 35, Porchester Terrace, W. 2, when the Chief Rabbi and Mrs. Percy Bigland gave inspiring addresses on "Peace." This subject was further discussed at the Annual General Meeting held at 14, Holland Park Road, W. 14, through the kind hospitality of Mrs. Robert Solomon, on Monday, 18th February. Lady (Herbert) Samuel was elected President and the Hon. Officers were re-elected for a further term. Stimulating addresses were delivered by the Rev. A. A. Green and Mrs. Israel Zangwill on the "Co-operation of Jewish Women in the Peace Movement," and as a result of these two meetings many members were enrolled in the Jewish Peace Society.

A Council Meeting was held at the Office on Monday, 11th March, to re-elect the Executive Committee. A General Meeting of the Union was held on the 18th June, through the

kindness of the Hon. Mrs. Franklin, at 50, Porchester Terrace, W. 2, when various aspects of the work of the Union were discussed. This proved of very great interest to the members, and it is hoped to arrange for further Meetings of a similar character in the future. A further Council Meeting was held by kind permission of Lady Spielman at 29, Cambridge Square, W. 2, on Monday, 21st October. Miss Halford reported on the work the Union had undertaken for the Palestinian refugees, and Mr. Ernest Lesser and Mr. Sidney Isaacs gave inspiring addresses on "Votes for Women Seatholders in the United Synagogue."

Social Gathering A very successful gathering of workers and friends of the Union was held by kind invitation of Mrs. F. D. Benjamin on Tuesday, 28th May, at 16, Dawson Place, W. 2. Members of the Junior Branch and Palestinian girl students were among those who received invitations, and all agreed that a very enjoyable evening was spent.

Votes for Women Seatholders The Union of Jewish Women has held but one Meeting during the year in connection with the movement to obtain equal rights for the woman seatholder in the United Synagogue, but that does not signify that the members have lost heart in the cause. On the contrary their determination to go forward is stronger than ever, their seeming inaction being in conformity with plans which it is hoped will materialise next year. Hitherto the Council's efforts have been directed towards obtaining voting rights only, but at the Meeting of the Council held in October the following Resolution was passed:—

"Resolved that the Union of Jewish Women take steps to obtain full voting and electoral rights for the women seatholders in the United Synagogue."

Arrangements are being made to address Meetings of women seatholders in various parts of London.

The World Congress of Jewish Women The most notable event in the record of the Jewish Women's Movement during the past year was the second World Congress of Jewish Women which took place in Hamburg from June 3rd to 6th. It had been summoned after

an interval of five years on the initiative of Mrs. Kohut, who delegated all arrangements to the German Council of Jewish Women. In response to the invitation to the Union, a delegation of six was appointed, headed by Mrs. Eichholz, who took the place of Lady Spielman, the latter being unavoidably prevented from attending. Her colleagues were Mrs. Alex. Cohen, Mrs. Basil Q. Henriques, Mrs. Neville Laski, and Miss Lizzie Hands. The subjects of discussion were: (a) "Religious and Educational Problems," to which Miss Hands contributed a paper on "Jewish Marriage and Divorce Laws," and Mrs. Basil Q. Henriques a paper on "Settlement Activities and Child and Adolescent Welfare." (b) "Social and Communal Problems"; and (c) "International Problems." The Congress concluded with a unanimous resolution to form a World Council of Jewish Women, of which Mrs. Rebecca Kohut was elected the first President with general acclamation, and among others Lady (Herbert) Samuel was appointed one of the Vice-Presidents and Mrs. Eichholz a Member of the Executive Committee. The Congress, which was attended by delegates from America, Palestine, and many European Countries, including a large contingent from Eastern Europe, aroused great general interest, and the meetings were crowded. The recognition that only through concerted action can many of the burning problems be solved was emphasised again and again. Mrs. Kohut, by her eloquence, by her firm and tactful handling of the assembly, and by her sympathy, was the outstanding personality of the Congress. Delightful hospitality and entertainment were provided by the Jewish women of the Hamburg community, a reception by the Burgomaster of Hamburg at the Senate House being particularly noteworthy. The outstanding impression of the Congress was the extreme gravity of the condition of the Jewries of Eastern Europe, spiritual and economic, which had its serious repercussions on Jewish womanhood.

Palestine Exhibition and West End Fair The Union accepted an invitation to take part in the Fair which was held under the auspices of the Economic Board for Palestine and the Jewish National Fund, from May 12th to 14th at the Queen's Hall. A special Sub-

Committee was formed under the chairmanship of Mrs. Eichholz, and in response to a letter of appeal to members of the Union both in London and the Provinces, donations and gifts in kind were received to furnish a "Lingerie and Gift Stall." The sum of £122 2s. 7d. was realised, a very satisfactory contribution towards the proceeds of the Fair, and the Committee desire to place on record their warm thanks to the energetic band of volunteers, and especially to Mrs. Ephraim Levine, Miss Alexander, and the Misses Lynes, who by their work contributed so much to the success of the Stall.

Palestine Emergency Fund At a Special Meeting of the Board of Deputies held to consider the best means of helping the victims of the outrages in Palestine, the Union of Jewish Women was asked to co-operate.

A cable from Palestine informed the Union that undergarments, boots, blankets, socks and stockings, men's shirts, materials for skirts and trousers, were urgently needed, and that materials should also be sent out to be made up by local workers into clothes for men, women and children. £1,000 was allocated to the Union from the Palestine Emergency Fund, and in a very short time all the articles specially requested were shipped by the quickest possible route. The Committee would like to record a special vote of thanks to Sir Charles Sykes, to Lt.-Col. Stanley Cohen, and to Mr. Salomon, who assisted them so greatly in their purchases. The entire shipment reached Palestine before the end of November, and the great appreciation with which the goods were received was reported in a letter from Mrs. Norman Bentwich which is here appended:

JERUSALEM.

30th November, 1929.

I am writing on behalf of the Relief Committee in Palestine to express to the Union of Jewish Women the very deepest gratitude for the consignment of clothes sent for the sufferers from the recent outrages. The goods are perfectly marvellous—far better than could be purchased locally, whatever sum one paid. The tweed, the

stockings, the pullovers and sweaters, the boots, the flannel, the blankets, each were greeted with cries of delighted admiration from our workers as they helped unpack them. It is impossible to thank the Union adequately, firstly for sending the goods; and secondly, for sending such really magnificent stuff.

The consignments have all arrived—and at the psychological moment. They came three days before the winter started—which it always does with a jerk here, overnight. Had they come earlier we should have been lothe to have given them out to some of the poorest refugees, as they are of such definitely marketable value, and the temptation would have been great. But we distributed them in the gales and rains of a Jerusalem storm, and the recipients left the storehouse wearing their new sweaters, stockings and shoes; and all the tailors of Hebron have been working day and night to make the suits and coats from the tweed.

I should have written a few days earlier to express our great gratitude. I apologize for the delay, and once more want to tell you how intensely we appreciate the goods.

U.J.W. Homes Association, Ltd. The Flatlets, of which mention had been made in preceding Reports, were completed early in May, and the first tenants took possession of their new homes on May 13th. Great has been their satisfaction in having such comfortable "Homes of their own." The majority of the tenants were installed and had furnished their rooms most tastefully, when, on June 23rd, the building was formally declared open by Lady Waley Cohen, and the Rev. A. A. Green performed the Consecration Ceremony and gave an inspiring address. All the single-roomed Flats and two self-contained ones are now occupied, and the House Committee of the tenants declare that everyone is happy and that all goes well. It was too late for the garden to be put in order when the workmen finally left at the end of May, but during the autumn, through the kindness and generosity of Lady Waley Cohen, it has

been beautifully arranged, and will prove an added delight to the tenants.

Women's Peace Crusade and Jewish Peace Society The Union is represented on the main body of the Women's Peace Crusade and also on several of their local branches. Two meetings were held by the Union (see page 8) to further the cause of Peace, and many members joined the Jewish Peace Society.

Junior Branch The Committee of the Union regret to announce that the Junior Branch has decided to discontinue its separate existence. Excellent work had been undertaken by the Branch; voluntary workers had been enrolled and entertainments organised. One of the very successful functions undertaken by the Junior members was the organisation of the Bazaar held in December, 1928, which resulted in over £190 being handed to the Union for their Necessitous Ladies' and Students' Benevolent Funds. The Committee of the Union hope that the Junior Branch, though ceasing to function as such, will be incorporated in the larger body and that its members will no longer regard themselves as Junior members, but active members of the Union proper.

Overseas Visitors The Union of Jewish Women receives many visitors from all parts of the world. Ladies from the Overseas Dominions or from foreign countries visiting England can always be sure of a hearty welcome from the Executive Committee. Among other ladies who have visited the Office this year, the Committee were pleased to welcome Miss Finkelstein from San Francisco and Mrs. Harris Cohen from Sydney. Visitors are gladly conducted over Communal Institutions, and are given every assistance and information. In this way an interchange of ideas is effected. The Union of Jewish Women is glad to learn the methods of working of other kindred Societies, and representatives of these Societies express themselves as eager to imbibe fresh ideas from England.

Jewish Students' Common Room The Union of Jewish Women was invited to co-operate with other Societies in a scheme organised by the Maccabæans

and the Liberal Jewish Synagogue to provide a Common Room for Jewish Students permanently or temporarily resident in London. The Inaugural Meeting was held in October at the Montefiore Hall, resulting in the registration of 105 students. The students elect their own Executive Committee and will decide on their own activities. Rooms have been lent them, and furniture supplied by the kindness of members of the Liberal Jewish Synagogue and other friends.

District Meetings The Union has resolved to resume its practice to hold Meetings in various parts of London to stimulate interest in its work among those ladies who were not previously conversant with its activities. With the co-operation of Mrs. Walter Levin, the first of these Meetings is taking place early in December in North London.

Necessitous Ladies' Fund The Hahn Bequest has again been the backbone of the Fund for assisting gentlewomen. To this Fund has been added the proceeds of the Bazaar organised by the Junior Branch. Thus many ladies, too proud to ask, have been relieved of immediate anxiety and have been given fresh hope and encouragement to face the difficulties which beset them. Many ladies, unable to earn through old age or ill-health, receive a small regular assistance from the Fund. Holidays have been arranged and medical help procured.

Holidays It is a great pleasure to record the number of holidays given to workers and elderly ladies. Many girls and women, working hard the whole year on a salary scarcely enough for their daily needs, are given a sufficient sum to defray the cost of a holiday at the seaside or in the country, and are thus enabled to gain renewed strength. The freedom of choice of time and place adds greatly to the enjoyment and benefit which these gifts afford.

Gifts and Thanks The Committee acknowledge gratefully gifts of garments from the Queen Mary's London Needlework Guild, the Jewish Ladies' Clothing Association, the Brondesbury Sewing Guild, and not least, from those private donors whose splendid parcels are greatly appreciated. The Committee wish to thank the Grocery

Relief Fund and the Passover Relief Fund, also the Society for the Distribution of Bread, Meat and Coal Tickets, for their generous help.

Grateful thanks are due to the Hon. Solicitor and the Hon. Medical Advisers, whose help has been so frequently and so ungrudgingly given during the past year. Mrs. Hoster has once again generously given a scholarship at her Secretarial College to a nominee of the Union. Special mention must be made of Mrs. E. Van Noorden's great kindness as a voluntary rent collector for the Flatlets, where she visits regularly every week.

Volunteers Miss Ruth Barnett continues her interest and work in keeping the accounts of the Necessitous Ladies Fund; Miss Esther Nassauer gives regular weekly assistance in the Office. The services of both of these ladies are greatly appreciated. Mrs. Cowan and Miss Doniger are new recruits to the volunteers who help at the Office, and Miss Simmons continues to fill in any vacancy and helps greatly in the arrangement and distribution of clothes and in other work.

Staff Miss Van Noorden is proving herself an excellent, efficient and industrious Secretary. She is enthusiastic in her work and has been able to enrol excellent volunteers, who work with her in the same spirit. Miss B. Barnett continues to give every satisfaction in her clerical duties.

Finance The financial position of the Union during the past year has been somewhat more satisfactory, the income having been sufficient for its needs with the exception of £10 9s. 5d., which is the deficit for the year. The Committee gratefully welcomes a considerable number of new subscribers and acknowledges the receipt of many donations. It is these which have made it possible for the expenditure to be covered. The most rigid economy in all the work is the invariable practice, and it is, therefore, desirable to try and obtain an increased number of members. It is hoped that with a still larger membership the deficit will be converted into a satisfactory surplus.

UNION OF JEWISH WOMEN'S LOAN FUND.

During the period under review the Loan Fund has, as in the past, been of great benefit to young girls and women wishing to train for professional careers. There are at the moment 22 trainees on the Register, and it is hoped that when their training and courses of study have been completed, good posts will be found for them. A variety of courses are undertaken by these students, including Teaching, Secretarial work, Dispensing, Domestic Economy and Radiography, but as reported last year, it is to be regretted that so far no one has applied for assistance to train as a Nurse or Matron. It is again emphasised that the Union would welcome any suitable candidate to train for either of these careers, as women of this type are urgently needed for Communal Institutions. During the year three students have completely repaid their loans to the Union, and four new loans have been granted, amounting to the sum of £121 5s. Repayments during the year amount to the sum of £138 8s., which is a decrease on last year's figures, but is due to the fact that most of the loans now outstanding are of more recent date, and in 50 per cent. of the cases repayment has not yet commenced. It is again pointed out that the fact that no bad debts have been incurred, is due to the care that is taken to advise suitable careers, which are most likely to prove successful. All loans granted are entirely free of interest, and repayments are due to commence only when training is completed and a good post obtained. The Secretary is always to be seen at the Office by appointment, and is ever ready to assist with advice or information anyone applying to her for such help: all interviews are given in private. The Union obtains the latest information as to suitable and new careers open to women.
