Reasons why Women are Wanted on Town Councils.

- BECAUSE the Councils are the Education Authorities, and the administration of national education, whether elementary, secondary or technical, cannot be efficient unless women take part in it as councillors. The Councils also have duties in respect to the medical inspection and feeding of school children and to the employment of children, and also have power to provide school clinics, nursery schools, open-air and vacation classes.
- BECAUSE no residential institution for children or women should be without the supervision of women.
- BECAUSE the Councils are the Sanitary Authorities, and their duties include enforcing the provision of proper sanitary accommodation and water supply in all dwelling-houses and factories. The Councils have duties in connection with the prevention and notification of disease. They may establish and maintain hospitals; and they must, to prevent the spread of infection, disinfect houses. The Councils may arrange for the nursing and care of tuberculous cases.
- BECAUSE there is a crying need for homes for the people, and the Councils have large powers in respect to Housing and Town Planning.
- BECAUSE the Councils are responsible for the well-ordering of common lodging-houses.
- BECAUSE the Councils have duties under the Acts relating to notification of births and maternity and child welfare, and they can provide baby hospitals, and lying-in-homes and help for expectant mothers.
- BECAUSE the Councils can impose regulations as to the preparation, storage and distribution of articles of food, and they inspect Dairies, Milkshops, Bakeries and Restaurants.
- BECAUSE the arrangements for women in Baths and Wash-Houses require the supervision of women.
- BECAUSE the Councils can supply and maintain public libraries and have the duty of inspecting and controlling cinematograph shows.
- BECAUSE the Councils have powers for Fire Prevention.
- BECAUSE the Councils have to carry out the Old Age Pensions Acts.
- BECAUSE the Councils can provide public parks, recreation grounds and open spaces, in which they can supply music and games. They can also provide allotments.
- BECAUSE the Councils employ women officials as well as men, and on the selection and conditions of work of officials ultimately depends the success of local government work.
- BECAUSE, in general, women are accustomed to look into detail in expenditure, and this tends to economy.
