CLINIC SESSIONS (see page 8)

The Clinic at its opening, 12 years ago, had two Birth Control Sessions weekly in the hands of two medical officers.

There are now 4 Birth Control Sessions and 3 Gynae-cological Sessions weekly, and 2 special Sessions per month for psychological help to difficult cases; these Sessions are in the hands of the regular staff of 7 medical officers and 3 clinical assistants. Mr. G. W. Theobald, M.D., F.R.C.S., for whose continued help warmest thanks are due, remains the Honorary Consultant, to whom patients from the Gynaecological Sessions are referred and through whom cases are admitted, when necessary, as in-patients to St. Mary Abbott's Hospital, Marloes Road.

The Sessions for giving psychological help to difficult cases are conducted by Dr. Joan Malleson who, as mentioned in the last report, very generously gave her services voluntarily for several months while this new venture was in an experimental stage. These special Sessions quickly proved themselves to be filling a real need and are of great help to the patients attending them, and now form a permanent part of the work of the Clinic. In addition to patients referred to Dr. Malleson from other departments of the Clinic, patients are also sent from St. George's Hospital, the Brompton Hospital, the Maudsley Hospital, and the Hospital for Epilepsy and Nervous Diseases.

During the year Clinical Assistants were appointed to three of the Birth Control Sessions. The appointments are for a period of six months, and it is felt that this course is of

great value to the Birth Control movement as a whole, as a wide clinical experience of the subject is thus gained by a group of doctors whose services are afterwards at the dispos-

al of the public.

Two trained nurses assist at each Session and training is given to nurses, midwives, social workers &c. During the year Sessions have been visited by doctors from India, S. Africa, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, U.S.A., China, Malay, Irak, Irun, and New Guinea, as well as from all parts of the United Kingdom. On several occasions medical officers from Local Authorities proposing to start Birth Control Clinics of their own, have attended Sessions to get information and to study procedure.

LECTURES

Eleven Lecture-Demonstrations for Post-Graduates and advanced medical students, on "The Theory and Practice of Contraception" were given during the year by members of the medical staff; and Dr. Helena Wright was invited to lecture on two occasions at the Post-Graduate School, Ducane Road, Hammersmith.

The Medical Committee has issued in a four-page leaflet a Summary and explanation of methods, which is being widely distributed to the medical profession.

FOLLOW-UP WORK

Thanks to a special grant from Mrs. Arthur Mitchison, it has been possible to undertake "Follow-Up" work in the case of those patients who fail to return to the Clinic after their initial visit. In this way we are able to ascertain their reasons for not returning and to judge whether methods and procedure can be modified to meet the difficulties of different types of patients. It is, however, very gratifying to report that there is an increasing tendency for patients to return at regular intervals to the Clinic.

LOCAL AUTHORITIES

Patients are now referred officially to Sessions from six Borough, Urban District or County Councils, from whom annual grants or capitation fees are received. The Royal Borough of Kensington increased its annual grant during the year from £50 to £100; and thanks are due to The Public Health Department of the Borough for willing advice and assistance on many occasions. It will be understood that all Local Authorities referring patients to the Clinic, act within the limits laid down by the Ministry of Health.

MEETINGS AND ENTERTAINMENTS

In November 1935, on the occasion of the Annual Meeting, at which Viscount Buckmaster took the Chair, the subscribers had the privilege of welcoming, and listening to an address from Mrs. Margaret Sanger, the pioneer of the Birth Control movement in America. Thanks are due to Mrs. Robert Solomon, who kindly lent her beautiful house for this Meeting.

In December 1935, Mr. and Mrs. Thornely Gibson gave a concert in aid of the Clinic funds. The fame of their delightful singing is so widespread that all seats were sold out long before the Concert, which was in consequence of great benefit to the Clinic. The Committee is deeply grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Thornely Gibson for providing such a delightful evening and for all the trouble they took to ensure its complete success.

In March 1936 a most enjoyable Poetry Recital was given by Viscountess Buckmaster at 4 St James's Square, by kind permission of Viscountess Astor, M.P. This also was crowded, and made many new friends for the Clinic. Miss Eva Moore took the chair.

A Meeting for Hospital Almoners was planned early in the year to interest them more fully in the work and obtain their co-operation, and invitations were sent out to a large number of hospitals. So many acceptances were received that four most successful Meetings were held, attended by over 100 Almoners from 45 Hospitals. Addresses were given by members of the medical staff and of the Committee, and discussion followed.

Many applications were received during the year for speakers at different Meetings, and a very large number of visitors came to the Clinic to learn more about its activities, including a party of about 25 students from the Third International Conference on Social Work.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: FORMATION OF COUNCIL

Considerable simplification was effected during the year by a re-organisation of Committees. These now consist of an Executive Committee, a Medical Committee and a Finance Committee, which meet at regular intervals.

It was also decided to form a Council of prominent supporters of the aims and work of the Clinic. The names of those who so far have consented to serve are printed on the title-page of this report.

During the year, the Executive Committee was greatly strengthened by the addition of Mrs. Basil Herbert, Dr. M. W. Geffen and Miss Christobel Robinson. Dr. Geffen is a member of the Public Health Committee of the Kensington Borough Council, and has for many years practiced in North Kensington. We temporarily lost the active co-operation of Mrs. Marjorie Farrer, who for reasons of health had to give up work for a year. We are glad to welcome Mrs. Farrer back to the Committee for the coming year. Mrs. Margaret Lloyd has taken Mrs. Farrer's place as Vice-Chairman. Other members of the Committee who were not able to give time to the work, have preferred to become members of the Council, so that we retain the support in this way of such old and valued friends as Lady Sprigge, Mrs. Cuthbert Baines, Mr. Harold Chapple, Dr. Marjory Edwards, Dr. Gray, Mme. Paul Maze and Miss Pennefather.

CLINIC STAFF AND ORGANISATION

It has been found that the system of office work adopted last year needed considerable modification. After careful consideration it has been decided that the Clinic Superintendent should be responsible for all business at the Clinic and that she should be assisted by two subordinates, one for the patients and Sessions and one for the secretarial and finance duties. This change has necessitated losing the services of Mrs. Goldney, our extremely efficient Secretary, who has our sincere thanks for the excellent work she has done during the 18 months she has been with us. Mrs. Wylson continues to be Clinic Superintendent, with Mrs. Cattran as full-time assistant on the Clinic side. These two officers have shewn great devotion to the Clinic

and all its interests and the Committee is deeply appreciative of their work. Miss Marjorie Hewitt has been appointed as book-keeper and secretarial clerk.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES

The Committee feels that much help is needed in preparing young women for the problems of marriage and motherhood. It is clear that a centre of this sort is in a unique position to give guidance on these questions, for the relationship which is established between doctor and patient is successful in breaking down the barriers of shyness and reserve present in dealing with intimate personal and psychological problems. It has therefore been decided to try the experiment of holding informal talks for young women, both married and unmarried, which will be guided by a member of the medical staff and possibly also by an experienced lay speaker.

The Committee is, moreover, aware of the increasing public interest in the problems of population especially in view of the falling birth rate. We feel a special responsibility both to the public and to the hundreds of young women who come or may come to the Clinic for advice, to emphasize that our work is directed to the improvement of family life and therefore to a healthier and happier population. We believe that this consideration is of greater importance than mere numbers, and that the *control* of conception is essential to the achievement of this end; but this does not imply a small family for those parents who can give their children a reasonable chance of health and independence.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

At the time of the last Report the financial position was causing considerable anxiety and there was the possibility of a serious deficit in the coming year. It was decided to apply to the London County Council for the admission of the Clinic to the list of those charities approved by them for benefiting from Sunday Cinema performances. This application was fortunately granted and, thanks particularly to the efforts of our valued friend Sir John Ramsay, six different Cinemas agreed to contribute towards the total weekly sum allowed. This has put our finances on a more

satisfactory basis and it is even possible to contemplate long-wished-for expansion and development. The Cinemas which are contributing in this way to our work and relieving us of a great part of our financial cares appear in the list of subscribers at the end of this report; but we should like to express here our deepest gratitude for their generous help.

The Committee has hitherto had to spend much time and energy every year in organising an entertainment to supplement subscriptions and this has meant an extra appeal to the generosity of our subscribers. The help of the Cinemas has enabled us this year to dispense with such extra effort, thus leaving us free to devote ourselves to the work of the Clinic. Nevertheless the regular help of our subscribers is fundamental to our prosperity and although private subscriptions have unfortunately fallen a little, we venture to hope that old friends will not desert the Clinic in the belief that it can prosper without them.

There is still a mortgage of £400 on the building, but it is thought desirable to widen the work of the Clinic before attempting to pay this off.

The Clinic premises were badly in need of repair and decoration and over £150 of the balance in hand is being spent on these necessary renovations.

FINANCE SUB-COMMITTEE

Mr. Arthur Moon has had to resign from the Finance Committee and his place has been filled by Mr. Harold Rubinstein.

The Finance Committee has decided to appeal to our larger subscribers to promise their subscription for seven years in order that the Clinic may recover, without any extra cost or trouble to the subscriber, the income tax on each such subscription.
