affords a convenient and non-political meeting place for professional women of all vocations. It has a membership capacity of 800, and is situated between Regent Street and Piccadilly, within a few minutes' walk of St. James's Park and the leading art galleries and theatres. Its members include doctors and research workers, lecturers, teachers, head-mistresses and principals of colleges, painters and sculptors, architects, musicians, authors and journalists, nurses, masseuses, gymnastic instructors, travellers, explorers and sportswomen.

A few bedrooms are available, the use of which is limited to a fortnight currently. The daily and weekly papers, books of reference, monthly reviews and other periodicals, are supplied. There is a silence room for reading and writing, and a gallery for the exhibition of members' work. Lectures and entertainments are arranged at intervals. Lunch and dinner are served daily from 12.30 to 2.30 and from 6.30 to 8.30 respectively. The prices of lunch are 1/6 and 2/6, and of dinner 2/6and 3/6, or à la carte, and a vegetarian menu at 1/8 is always provided.

Election to the club is by the personal recommendation of two members, or the presentation of two social references. The annual subscription is £5-5-o for town members. £4-4-o for country, £2-2-o for Irish, and £1-1-o for foreign and colonial, beginning as from January or July; and this is payable by the half-year if desired. All members are required to take a share of £1 in the Halcyon Club Ltd., but the usual entrance fee of £1-1-o is suspended during the present year.
