



REPORT

for the Year ended 30th November, 1938.

The work of the Union during the past year, like that of every other communal organisation, has been affected by the increasing influx of refugees. Owing to the office being in Woburn House, not a day passes without many refugees calling for advice or assistance.

Refugee and other organisations refer constantly to the office for information and direction. This has taken up a considerable part of the working day but that it has been of some value and has brought comfort to the harassed and unfortunate is testified by the number of grateful letters received.

Owing to the general situation, the usual work of the Union has increased in almost every branch. Naturally this involves additional expenditure and the Committee, while grateful for the continued interest of members, earnestly appeal for sustained and increased support to meet the additional demands made by this larger volume of work.

Vice-Presidents. The Committee are glad to report that Mrs. Lionel de Rothschild has consented to become a Vice-President and has thus once more evinced her interest in the work of the Union.

Committee

Early in the year, the Committee were glad

to welcome three new members, Mrs. Oliver Sebag-Montefiore, Mrs. Wilfred S. Samuel; and Miss Hilda Schlesinger, whose connection with the Jewish Board of Guardians and many communal and other organisations makes her co-operation especially valuable.

Members of the Executive, as representatives of the Union, have responded to the ever increasing demands on their time and service rendered necessary by the overwhelming 10

urgency of rescue of the thousands of victims from the lands of persecution.

Dr. Claude G. Montefiore

During the year, the Union lost a staunch and generous supporter in Dr. Claude G. Montefiore whose death was felt as a grievous

personal loss by all who knew him. This is not the place to speak of the unique position he held within and without the Community nor of his work, except as regards the Union which, from its inception, had in him a friend to whom to turn with the full assurance of his willing and generous help.

The Committee deplore the loss, during the past twelve months, of many other old friends who have passed away.

to all members of the Union for support for
the work of the Jewish Defence Committee,
formerly the Co-ordinating Committee, in
combating anti-Semitism in England. An

immediate and generous response from members resulted in the sum of \pounds 130 being handed over to the Co-ordinating Committee.

Annual General The Annual General Meeting took place on Meeting 7th March, 1938, at 7 Mansfield Street, by kind invitation of Lady FitzGerald. In the

absence abroad of the President, Lady Spielman referred briefly to the activities of the Union during the past year. The Hon. Mrs. Home Peel, Hon. Parliamentary Secretary of the National Council of Women, then gave an account of the fifty years' work of the International Council of Women.

Lady Spielman gave a delightful evening At Home for friends and workers of the Union on 19th July at 29, Cambridge Square,

when a musical programme rendered by Miss Alice Schwarz

(soprano) and Miss Rachel Cavallo (pianist) contributed to the success of the evening.

Overseas Visitors

A number of overseas visitors, among them Mrs. Saffra, President of the Union of Jewish

Women of South Africa, have been welcomed at the office during the year and have been introduced to organisations whose work was of especial interest to them. The Committee are glad of such opportunities of hearing at first-hand of the work of Jewish women in the Dominions and abroad.

Palestine Exhibition and Fair

The Union decided to co-operate in the notable undertaking of the Jewish National Fund to hold a Palestine Exhibition and Fair, which took place at the Queens Hall

on 21st, 22nd and 23rd June, by undertaking the Baby Linen Stall. A special Committee was appointed under the Chairmanship of Mrs. Eichholz and intensive work was organised between the months of March and June. The Committee desire to place on record their grateful thanks to the members of the Union and others for the splendid response to their appeal for offers of help in time, money and goods which were received from all over the country. It is impossible to mention all to whom the success of the stall is indebted but especial mention should be made of the honorary officers Mrs. Geoffrey Whitehill, the Treasurer, and Mrs. Harry A. Lesser, the Honorary Secretary, Mrs. Lewis-Barned who lent her house for a successful concert, Miss Alexander who held the meetings at her flat, and other energetic helpers who assisted in countless ways. The sum of £410 18s. 10d. was raised by the efforts of the Union

Chief Rabbi Presentation The Union took part in the Presentation to the Chief Rabbi on the occasion of his

Silver Jubilee in March and Lady Spielman spoke on behalf of the women of the Community at a reception held in his honour. The Committee were glad to have this opportunity of testifying to their admiration of the service Dr. Hertz has rendered to the Community.

Jewish Women's Luncheon Club

The Luncheon Club, formed under the auspices of the B'nai B'rith First Women's Lodge of England, the Union of Jewish Women, the Federation of Women Zionists and the Women's Zionist Organisation, can

report a successful year, addresses being given on a variety of interesting and topical subjects. The speakers have included the Chief Rabbi, Miss Ellen Wilkinson, M.P., Mrs. Corbett Ashby, Dr. Nathan Morris, M.A., D.Litt. The Committee have entertained a number of overseas visitors at these luncheons, which are held on the last Wednesday or Thursday alternately of each month. The Club affords opportunities for friendly and new contacts among its members, and stimulates the interchange of opinions and ideas. Membership of the Club costs 2s. 6d. and the luncheons cost 2s. 9d. per head.

Necessitous Ladies' Fund (Kate Halford Memorial and

The Committee considered that it would be a fitting memorial to Miss Halford to incorporate her name in this Fund. Miss Halford evinced her never-failing interest in those in **Hahn Bequest**) need by a legacy of £50 to this Fund and a number of her friends and colleagues sent

spontaneous donations as a tribute to her work. The Treasurer and Committee wish to record their gratitude for this legacy and their appreciation of these contributions.

The assistance of gentlewomen in distress is one of the most important parts of the welfare work carried on by the Union. No two of the gentlewomen in need of assistance present the same problem and the help given is carefully adapted to the needs of each individual. They can be divided roughly into two categories : the elderly, needing help in their declining years, and the middle-aged, temporarily at the end of their resources. For the first a sufficient income and extra help in emergencies must be found ; for the second the means to live until such time as they can be rehabilitated and rendered fit to work.

Mrs. Hoster's Scholarship.

Several applications were received for the Scholarship which Mrs. Hoster generously grants for free training at her Secretarial

Training College on the recommendation of the Union. The student chosen had taken a German Honours Degree at London University.

The Scholarship is open to Jewish girls with special qualifications; it covers all the College fees and books required.

These Funds consist of the Union of Jewish Loan Funds Women's Loan Fund and the Louisa, Lady Goldsmid Fund.

The Funds are available for loans to enable educated Jewish women and girls to train for professional and other careers. Loans are granted to cover fees, maintenance and expenses incidental to training. In many cases this help makes all the difference to a girl's future and enables her to take up work for which she feels herself specially suited.

The amount paid during the year in respect of new loans was £345 10s. 0d. and in respect of additional loans £80 2s. 0d., whilst instalments on loans previously promised to six trainees came to £314 8s. 4d., making a total of £740 0s. 4d. from both Funds. This necessitated the sale of investments to the amount of f_{500} , thus carrying out the policy of the Committee to utilize the Funds to the utmost extent possible.

There are at present forty-nine loans outstanding, from both funds amounting to $f_{2,250}$ 16s. 1d., and repayments during the year amounted to f_{200} 6s. 0d.

Four loans have been paid off:

Loan of £20 in 1928 for Teaching. Loan of £25 in 1936 for Midwifery.

Loan of $\pounds 6$ 6s. 0d. in 1937 for Ll.B. examination fees. Loan of $\pounds 6$ in 1938 for Nursing.

During the year six students have finished training, five of whom have found work, while the sixth hopes to start work shortly.

The Committee are constantly in touch with girls during and after training so that they can give advice or help in obtaining work. The following extract is typical of the many letters of appreciation received from trainees :

"Some debts one can never hope wholly to repay and this is one of them. I should be very happy if you would be kind enough to convey to your Committee my deep thanks and sincere appreciation of all they have done for me, in granting the loan, in waiting so long for its repayment and in showing a sympathetic interest in my welfare throughout."

Loans have been made from the Union Loan Funds in a number of cases referred by the Women's Employment Federation scheme, under which the Committee co-operate with other Loan Funds Societies. The information and experience gained through this co-operation has proved of much value.

Helen LucasThe period of five years for which the CharityBequestCommissioners sanctioned the Scheme, under
which grants are made for holidays and

convalescence to gentlewomen, expired in November when the Charity Commissioners extended the Scheme for a further period of five years. The three original Trustees still serving, Lady Spielman, Mrs. Eichholz and Mrs. Alexander Cohen, were re-appointed by the Executive Committee of the Union, who felt that the success of the Scheme was largely due to the sympathetic and capable manner in which the Trust had been administered by the Trustees under the Chairmanship of Lady Spielman.

During the past year seventy-nine grants have been made, thirty-nine for holidays and forty for convalescence. The amount expended was considerably larger than in previous years. This is partly accounted for by an increase in the number of grants made for convalescence, which are usually larger than those made for holidays, and partly by more grants to German refugees.

The usual grant covers the cost of a fortnight's holiday, but in cases of convalescence the amounts are fixed according to circumstances and the length of stay recommended by the doctor.

A feature of the Bequest is that the individual is free to make all her own arrangements for holiday or convalescence, so that no-one need know that she has received assistance, and this is an important factor in enabling her to obtain the utmost benefit from the change.

Applications for grants are considered by a small body of Trustees and are treated confidentially and as expeditiously as possible. How much this is appreciated is shown by the following extract from a letter from one organisation which had referred a number of cases : "the willingness of the Trustees to help and the speed with which it was done are what we admire."

Delissa Joseph In the spring, Mrs. Delissa Joseph formed **Memorial Trust** a new Trust, the income to be devoted to

holidays for Jewish women teachers and, at her request, the Union undertook the administration by means of three Trustees to be appointed by the Executive Committee. The Trust Fund, amounting to \pounds 1,080, was placed in the hands of the Charity Commissioners and Mrs. Alexander Cohen, Mrs. Eichholz and Miss Sarah Samuel were appointed as Trustees. Applications for grants should be made to the Union.

Employment ' Bureau

The trend against employment of older women still persists. Moreover, the lighter domestic posts, to which women without

special qualifications could adapt themselves, have greatly decreased. Owing to the general situation, office posts have been fewer but, during the latter part of the year, a considerable number of vacancies in the Refugee organisations have been filled by the Union.

Finance The Committee gratefully acknowledge receipt of a legacy of $\pounds 50$ from Miss Halford for the General Fund of the Union.

They are, however, greatly concerned about the financial position as, owing to the passing of many old friends and to the international situation, the annual income has been considerably reduced. If every member would make an effort to introduce new members, it would make the Union more representative and the work could be strengthened and extended without recourse to outside functions.

The Committee would like to thank Mrs. B. Gardner for her kindness in lending her house for a very successful Luncheon and Bridge, which realised £33 3s. 6d. for the funds of the Union.

Honorary The Committee again wish to express their appreciation of the very valuable help received from their Honorary Solicitors, Messrs. Herbert Oppenheimer, Nathan & Vandyk, and from their Honorary Auditor, Mr. Louis Jacobs, M.B.E., F.C.A.

The Committee are glad to report that Dr. J. Snowman, M.R.C.P., has consented to act as their Honorary Medical Adviser and his advice has already proved most helpful. They also wish to express their acknowledgments to Miss Muriel E. Landau, M.D., F.R.C.S., Mr. A. Harold Levy, M.D., F.R.C.S. and Mr. Eric A. Van Noorden, L.D.S., R.C.S. Eng.

Gifts Gifts in kind from the Society for Distributing Bread, Meat and Coal, the Passover Relief Fund of the Jewish Soup Kitchen, the Jewish Ladies' Clothing Association and the Queen Mary's London Needlework Guild are greatly appreciated. The Committee also wish to thank many individual friends for gifts of clothing. These gifts are a valuable means of supplementing assistance from the funds.

(Kate Halford Memorial and Hahn Bequest.)
