I have been a consistent supporter of ordinary discretion, in putting
of Women's Suffrage for 35 years - and the outcome of my
experience is that our cause is
hindered more than by
the policy of our self, than the
opposition of the other self.

As a matter of fact I was
surprised at the number of men
who favour Women's Suffrage
among my more acquaintances,
but who are constantly disgusted

by our want of good sense & lack
of ordinary discretion, in putting
forth our just claim to the
franchise.
