UNION OF JEWISH WOMEN.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30th NOVEMBER, 1927.

The Committee of the Union of Jewish Women present their Report for the year 1927, during which period the Twenty-Fifth Anniversary of the Foundation of the Union was celebrated.

This quarter of a century of united effort for religious, social and moral welfare has drawn together women of all shades of opinion in the Jewish Community, and has established a bond between English Jewesses and their sisters in the Overseas Dominions and abroad. Development in the future must be directed towards closer co-operation between the great Councils of Jewish women the world over; and thus promote that deeper knowledge and sympathy which translates sentiments of kinship into a live interest of practical difficulties and their solution.

The Council has suffered serious loss during the past year by the death of valued colleagues. Early in January, Viscountess Bearsted, a Vice-President, passed away, and in August Mrs. Arthur Q. Henriques, who had been a member of the Union since its inception, and from 1906 to 1919 acted as Treasurer. Her memory will endure as an invaluable Treasurer and as an enthusiastic and helpful colleague.

Committee Mrs. Cecil Q. Henriques, who has been the able Treasurer of the Loan Funds since 1911, tendered her resignation, and Lady Instone has kindly consented to fill this post. This Fund has always been recognised as one of the most helpful activities of the Union, and its success is due in large measure to its capable administration. It is confidently felt that Lady Instone will bring the same capacity and sympathy to the work as her predecessor.

Mrs. Harry Salmon has retired from the Executive Committee on account of pressure of other work, but it is gratifying to note that she has become a Vice-President. Miss Sadie B. Isaacs was appointed a member of the Executive as representative of the Junior Branch.

Correspondents It is with regret that the death of Mrs. M. E. Solomons of Dublin has to be recorded. She was a valued friend and colleague and had been Correspondent since 1902, and was one of the original members of the Union. Her successor is Mrs. Herzog, who is warmly welcomed. Owing to her departure from Manchester, Mrs. E. Charles Singer relinquished her work as Correspondent and Mrs. Neville J. Laski has undertaken to fill this post. The Union welcomes Madame Berman and Madame Ginsburger as Correspondents for Brussels.

Junior Branch The Junior Branch has almost concluded its third year. There have been several changes on the Executive Committee, Miss Phyllis Abrahams acted as Deputy Chairman in the temporary absence from London of Miss Doris Herz. It was decided by the Union that one of the Hon. Secretaries should represent the Junior Branch on the Executive Committee of the Union. The "Bluebird" Concert Party, under the able direction of Mrs. Leo Sharp, has been most successful and has already given over twenty performances to various charitable institutions. The Rev. E. Levine gave a series of most interesting lectures to members of the Hebrew Section of the Branch. Applications are continually made for helpers for various forms of social work, and the Branch has been instrumental in finding six helpers for a Stepney Play Centre, three Care Committee workers, two Hon. Secretaries, six workers for the Jewish Health Organisation, three clerical workers and a Guider. The Executive is anxious to extend the membership so that new activities can be undertaken in the coming year.

Votes for Women Seatholders The movement in connection with obtaining the vote for the woman seatholder in the Constituent Synagogues of the United Synagogue has been actively advanced by the Union of Jewish Women for many years past; but an influential Committee of men and women—all Seatholders of the United Synagogue—has recently been formed with the object of enlisting local support from their respective Synagogues. The Union has, therefore, resolved that it is in the best interest of the Cause to abstain from taking independent action for the present.

Consecration for Girls It is gratifying to note that the movement in favour of Consecration for Girls, initiated by the Union and closely allied to the question of their religious education, has received further support from Ministers and teachers in London, the Provinces and Overseas Dominions. At the recent Conference in Manchester on November 20th, on Jewish Religious Education, a paper was read by the Rev. Dr. A. Cohen of Birmingham on the Religious Education of Girls, and Mrs. Nathan Laski, and Mrs. Eichholz were invited to open the discussion. Mrs. Eichholz was able to stress the need for the period of preparation followed by the consecration service for the adolescent girl, and begged those delegates to take active steps to carry out the scheme in their own areas, where it was not already in operation.

Meetings The first Council Meeting of the Union's year was held at the office on December 31st, 1926, to hear the report presented by Mrs. Spielman on the future policy in regard to Votes for Women Seatholders in the United Synagogue, and a final statement on the Camp at Eastleigh for the Stranded Transmigrants, and the cessation of the Union's activities with its closing at the end of the year. Preliminary discussions on the forthcoming Conference also took place.

The Annual General Meeting was held on 21st February, 1927, at 44, Lancaster Gate, by kind permission of Mrs. F. S. Franklin. At this Meeting Mrs. Model was unanimously elected President for a further term of two years, and Lady Instone, Loan Fund Treasurer in place of Mrs. Cecil Q. Henriques. An emergency resolution, brought forward by Mrs. M. A. Spielman to support the Women's Organisations in asking for electoral franchise on the same terms as given to men, was carried with some dissentients after an animated discussion. Mrs. Eichholz addressed the Meeting on the subject of "Unfulfilled Needs of the Jewish Community," and in her summing up emphasised the need of effective and complete co-ordination of charities, more workers voluntary and professional and others schemes.

Lady Georgiana Mure was invited to explain the scheme and to make an appeal on behalf of the Queen Alexandra Memorial Fund for District Nurses.

The Conference The Conference was held on June 20th at the Grosvenor Hall and preceded the International Conference on the Traffic in Women and Children organised by the Jewish Association for the Protection of Girls and Women, thus enabling delegates and visitors from the British Empire, the United States and the Continent to attend the Union's Conference.

The proceedings opened with a prayer delivered by the Rev. A. A. Green, a constant and helpful friend of the Union. The President then welcomed the assembly and especially the foreign delegates who brought greetings from their various Councils and Societies. Amongst those who delivered inspiring messages, were Mrs. Hannah Solomon of the American Council of Jewish Women, Mrs. Hyamson and Miss Carrie Wise, both of New York, Miss Bertha Pappenheim, Mrs. Ollendorf and Mrs. Eschelbacher of the Jüdische Frauenbund, Madame Rose Melzer of Poland, Mrs. Basch of Rhodesia and several provincial members.

Mrs. M. A. Spielman addressed the Conference on "The Policy of the Union of Jewish Women as to action on Political, Social and Legislative Questions outside the Jewish Community" maintaining that it was in the best interests of the Union to extend its sphere of influence by co-operating with the leading Associations and Councils of Women on the same lines as are followed by Unions representing women of various denominations, social standing and callings of every description. Mrs. Spielman emphasised that such organisations are non-party, though they do much to promote legislation and secure support for the passage of Bills introduced in the interests of women and children. She urged that for the Union of Jewish Women to continue as a living force—inspiring, setting a standard and noting fresh tendencies—it must keep well in touch with workers in all fields of social endeavour both within and outside the Jewish Community. This was opposed by Miss Lucy Cohen on the grounds, firstly, that it might lead to dissention, and consequently reduce the number of those who while necessarily holding various political opinions, were yet willing to combine in a Union of Jewish Women; and secondly, that in England where Jewish women could and did take their part in all forms of public work, it was inadvisable and unnecessary to attempt to record a separate Jewish vote on questions not predominantly Jewish.

An animated discussion took place, but no vote was taken on the subject.

Mrs. J. H. Hertz presided over the second morning session which dealt with the subject of Palestine, more especially in relation to the condition of women and children. Mrs. Hertz in her opening remarks made a brief survey of recent development and her impressions of the religious, educational and economic conditions. Mrs. Eder spoke on the Chalutzin, the men and women of the intelligentsia, more particularly from Eastern Europe who perform pioneer work in colonisation, and Mrs. Irwell addressed the Meeting on Mother and Child Welfare and the Schools of Agriculture for girls, with particular reference to the obligations undertaken by the Women Zionist Organisations.

The third session opened under the Chairmanship of Lady (Herbert) Samuel and dealt with the question of co-ordination of Jewish Women's Institutions. Lady Samuel in her opening remarks, described the effort at co-ordination of the Women's Organisations in Palestine. Mrs. Eichholz in her address showed where co-ordination was effective as in religious education, and in maternity and child welfare work. She pointed out that there was scope for further co-ordination and interchange of thought in the work of Jewish Girls' Clubs, in Synagogue Guilds and in some of the smaller charities. Miss Schlesinger read a stimulating paper, giving an outline of the Scheme for Co-ordination of Jewish Charities which is in its infancy. She pointed out that its aim should be the prevention of overlapping, the amalgamation of charities doing similar work, consultation and co-operation in administration and purchase of goods and regulations of appeals, together with a central financial fund. Efforts would be directed towards new sources of revenue, especially in the discovery of the non-giver of whom there were many in the Community.

The final session, at which Mrs. Model presided, was devoted to the problem of housing accommodation for the necessitous gentlewoman—a problem which is constantly before the Union. Miss Halford, in a sympathetic address, placed before her audience the difficulties of the gentlewoman of limited means, and then propounded a scheme for the erection of Flatlets in conjunction with the United Women's Homes Association, Ltd. Her scheme was received with great enthusiasm and many promises of financial help were

forthcoming. It is gratifying to state that the Scheme has developed further. A suitable site has been found in Petherton Road on which Flatlets for twenty gentlewomen will be built, and a Sub-Committee of ladies has been formed, of which Miss Halford has kindly consented to act as Hon. Secretary. The Union is now registered as a Public Utility Society under the title of "The Union of Jewish Women's Homes Association, Ltd."

Mrs. Model concluded the Conference with an appeal for more voluntary workers and stated that instruction in office routine and visits to institutions would be arranged for any girl or woman anxious to offer her services.

Subsequent to the Conference Mrs. Harry Salmon held an evening reception for member of the Union and visitors to the Conference. A musical entertainment provided by Miss Margery Bentwich, Mrs. H. Aron, Miss Gallop and Mr. Vivian Gaster was greatly appreciated.

A Meeting was held in Manchester on November 21st, 1927, under the auspices of the Women's Lodge of the B'nai B'rith presided over by the Chairman, Mrs. Neville Laski, at which Mrs. Eichholz was invited to speak on the work of the Union of Jewish Women. Much interest was evinced in its many-sided activities and it is hoped that closer co-operation will result.

The Executive Committee welcomes the opportunity of visiting provincial centres and coming into personal contact with women of the various Jewish Communities.

Social Gatherings Two reunions have been held at the Office.

These Meetings keep the Committee in touch with professional workers, students and others to whom the Union is able to be of use in various ways.

Gift Stall At the Garden Fête at Lady (Herbert) Samuel's house on July 6th and 7th, in aid of Women's and Children's Welfare Work in Palestine, the Executive felt that members of all views would desire to take some share in the upbuilding of Palestine, and more especially in those efforts which are directed towards the welfare of women and children. They, therefore, decided to accede to the invitation of the Federation of Women Zionists to take a stall. A splendid response in donations and gifts was made by individual members and branches throughout the country. Special

mention must be made of the generous contributions from the ladies of Sheffield stimulated by the enthusiasm of Mrs. Stone, and by the South London Women's Lodge of the Achei B'rith. A special Sub-Committee was formed under the Chairmanship of Mrs. Eichholz which, in addition to some members of the Executive, was joined by Mrs. Michael Adler, Mrs. L. L. Lyons, Mrs. Hawke, Mrs. Rees, Miss Sharp and The Misses Lynes. The sum of £137 16s. 4d. was made at the stall, and warm thanks are rendered to all those who helped to produce so successful a result.

Loan Training Funds As already stated, Lady Instone has become Treasurer in place of Mrs. Cecil Q. Henriques. There are now twenty-seven names on the register, among whom are medical students, secretaries and teachers in training. Four new loans have been granted and six loans have been repaid in full during the last year, and all who have trained are in good posts. The repayments for the year amount to £248 17s. 2d. which is £65 11s. 1d. in excess of last year and loans to the amount of £177 6s. 8d. have been granted. A special subscription of £5 has been received from Mrs. Lucy Bierer to be utilised at the discretion of the Union for the benefit of a trainee.

The Loan Fund which was initiated in 1905 is designed to give training to the educated girl in professional careers by means of a loan without interest, to be repaid in instalments at the conclusion of her training when a post is obtained. All interviews are private. Efforts are made to obtain information as to new careers and to ascertain where there is absence of overcrowding.

It is interesting to note that the student who enjoyed Mrs. Hoster's scholarship in 1926 finished her training during this year and has obtained a good post. Mrs. Hoster has very generously offered a further scholarship and a lady will shortly start her training. The Committee wish to tender their most sincere thanks to Mrs. Hoster for this great privilege and for her help and expert advice, which she always places at the service of the Union.

Employment and Information Bureau The Bureau meets with increasing difficulties. The applicants are, for the most part, middle-aged women without definite training who are desperately in need of work. Com-

panion-housekeepers and governesses in private families are seldom required, and these are the posts for which the applicants frequently ask. There is a demand for Matrons of Institutions who must be active, and for nurses with general and midwifery training.

Necessitous Ladies Fund A Fund, part of which was given by Mr. Hahn in memory of his wife, is entrusted to the Union for the relief of gentlewomen who, through misfortune, would suffer grievously and silently and, but for an organisation such as this, would remain friendless and without resources. Further gifts and legacies have been received from time to time and are much appreciated. Help is given with sympathy and understanding and with great regard for the feelings of the recipient and takes various forms. Holidays are provided from this Fund, supplemented by special donations; grants are made to procure service for those who are aged or infirm or suffering from temporary illness, to purchase additional necessities, for part payment of dentures or surgical instruments or to meet some emergency. Gifts in kind, concert tickets, the provision of a wireless set in one instance, are all warmly appreciated and bring comfort and cheer into the barren lives of those among our co-religionists whose lot has fallen on evil days.

The Committee acknowledge with thanks the gift of garments from private donors and from the Queen Mary's London Needlework Guild. Parcels of grocery from the Grocery Relief Fund and the Passover Relief Fund; bread, meat and coal tickets and special donations for holidays for protégées.

Staff The Secretary, Miss Gilbey, has devoted herself with zeal and sympathy to the varied work of the Office and she has been ably supported by Miss Van Noorden. In the coming year Miss Van Noorden will be promoted to Secretary in place of Miss Gilbey who has tendered her resignation and to whom the Committee desire to express their warm appreciation of her services.

Voluntary Helpers The Committee thank all voluntary workers who have helped during times of stress of work, namely: Miss Ruth Barnett. Miss M.

Benjamin, Miss E. Kahn, The Misses Lynes, Miss Adelaide Marks, Miss Nassauer, Miss Ray Rosenfeld, Miss Simmons and Miss N. Van Noorden.

Removal of Office Owing to the expiration of Lease, new Offices have been taken at 33, Manchester Street, W. 1, and the removal took place early in September. Special thanks are due to Mrs. A. H. Levy and to Miss Van Noorden and many volunteers on whom fell the burden of removal and installation in the new premises.

Hon. Solicitor Warm thanks are also tendered to Major H. L. Nathan who has given valuable legal help on many occasions.

Representation on other Bodies The Union continues to be represented on important organisations, both inside and outside the community, and the list on page 6 demonstrates their widespread interest and the value which is placed on their co-operation.

Finance It is to be regretted that the financial position of the Union has not improved during the past year, and the effort to increase the number of annual subscribers has met with but a small measure of support.

The income this year benefited to the extent of £120 by the Bridge Tea kindly arranged by Mrs. Tanburn. Part of this sum had to meet a deficit of the previous year, and in spite of the balance remaining, this year again ends with a deficit of £52 12s. 9d.

The special entertainments which have to be arranged periodically to meet ordinary expenditure are not a satisfactory financial basis on which to run this organisation. The strength of the Union lies in its representative character and in the special needs which it has to fulfil from time to time. It is earnestly hoped that the efforts of the past year may appeal to a far larger public and that the small *minimum* subscription of 5s. may result in an enlarged membership which will add, not only financial, but also numerical strength, to the Union.
